The weather this year has been very abnormal...as we are hoping for Spring. It is starting to warm up and with this I will be incorporating our Spring / Summer maintenance schedule. You will also notice a lot more spot spraying of herbicides throughout the Golf Course to help control Spring and Summer weeds. The Rye grass on the fairways, tees, collars and approaches are starting to turn brown and die off. This is known as transition. We will also be applying herbicides and other cultural practices to help with the transition from the Rye, back to the Bermuda grass. There is also a few high traffic areas that have taking a beating this season, Spring growth along with pesticides and rain will help rejuvenate those areas. I apologize in advance for any inconvenience, enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.

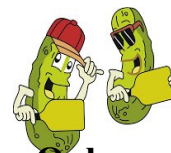

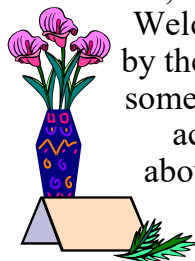

General Manager's Column

February started and ended with fantastic weather which helped us recoup our rounds that we were short in January. Golf rounds were up compared to February 2017 by 770; our restaurant covers were down compared to February 2017 by 500; so our revenues exceeded budget in Golf and Food by \$7,126. With the help from miscellaneous income we ended the month with total revenue exceeding budget by \$10,124. Cost of Goods Sold came in under budget by \$1,467 and expenses for February were under budget by \$1,092. February's **Net Income** beat budget by \$11,215.

The Golf Course is starting to see signs from last month's recorded heat wave. Our over seeding is leaving us a lot sooner than normal. The Bermuda has yet to wake up but Ray has put down fertilizer twice in the last five weeks so now we need a couple days of rain and in no time we will start to see the Bermuda starting to fill in.

Those of you who have had the pleasure of attending one of my "HOT DOG FEST" know what everyone else is missing. So those of you who have not had the opportunity to attend one in the past, I will be cooking hot dogs and brats at poolside on April 10 from 11:30 to 7:00PM. All draft beer, house wines, hot dogs and brats will be \$2 each; all other drinks will not be discounted. So come on out and enjoy the pool, dogs and drinks with your favorite BBQ chef ... ME!

Update on the weir: Bennett Construction went in and took out all of the contaminated sand in the filtering system and replaced it with all new sand and 2 inches of gravel. Originally this project was estimated to cost \$65,500; the final invoice is projected to be \$44,986.

It is that time of the year when we start to see our members fly north to their Northern palaces. The staff and I hope that you have a safe trip and we look forward to your return in November.

While you are up north we will be here putting in new irrigation on your Golf Course, new carpet, chairs, tables in your dining room and new appliances in your kitchen. This will be taking place around September, so when you get back we should be looking fresh again.

This time of year we start to see a lot more soliciting in Peridia where there is no soliciting permitted. Please if you see or have someone come to your door asking or selling call me ASAP so that I can come out and ask them to move on.

Someone asked if the Tiki Bar was taking all of our business from our Grill room? For the month of February I would say no, our Beverage sales were up by \$5,125. As we go through our first season with the Tiki Bar, we will track through our IBS system the sales comparison with the grill beverage sales over 2017. As the days get longer the Tiki Bar will help us give the late golfer a place to have a drink before going home. Our Tiki Bar dress code is proper bathing suites, tee shirts, shorts and an Ohio State hat. When dressed for the Tiki Bar please use the parking lot entrance.

Remember, I always have time for your questions or comments, so please stop by my office. My door is always open.

MASTER BOARD ANNOUNCEMENT

In an effort to maintain quality and safety as well as the best service possible to all our residents, the Master Board has established the following policy:

1. All residents with an outstanding balance remaining on their minimum can contact the Food and Beverage Manager to place any order larger than 3 meals before May 15. These orders will be treated like an event and must be received four days before requested day of pickup.
2. Raw food will not be available for to-go orders or any order, i.e. uncooked steaks/raw meat.
3. We do not have a package goods license for alcoholic beverages and by law cannot offer this as an option.

This policy will allow for the Chef and the F&B Manager to plan and order supplies for larger orders without shorting the dining membership each day.

SECURING YOUR HOME BEFORE GOING NORTH AND PROTECTING YOURSELF FROM CRIME

For those of you who did not attend the recent meeting at the Clubhouse regarding the above subjects, I will pass along some of the information given to us by Craig Cody who has a business that provides a service that will look after your home while you are away, and also by Deputy Chris Ralston from the Manatee Sheriff's Dept. who gave us some helpful tips to help keep ourselves, our property and our identity safe.

Before you leave to go up north, contact your alarm company and let them know that you will be away and make sure they have updated information for the numbers that you want them to call should your alarm go off. Notifications can be made via phone, text, e-mail, whatever you prefer, but if you are up north or away on an extended vacation, it is wise to have a contact person that has quick access to your home. Alarms sometimes will go off because of weather-related issues and not an attempted break-in but being able to access your property quickly is beneficial. When you leave, take a list of the service providers that maintain your property with you in case you need to contact them while you are away. Stop all mail and newspapers, make sure your sprinklers are on a timer and turn off the water to your house (not your irrigation water). Leave water in your toilets and turn off your ice maker. Should you lose power for an extended period, the ice will melt and run down onto your kitchen floor. Unplug all kitchen appliances, especially microwaves as they are susceptible to electrical current interruption. Have your air conditioner drain line and filter cleaned before you leave. Also, bring in all outdoor furniture, flower pots, anything that can become a projectile during a hurricane, causing damage to your home as well as your neighbor's homes. Last fall when Hurricane Irma hit, those of us that are full time residents, received numerous requests from snowbirds to bring in their outdoor furniture, board up their homes empty refrigerators/freezers and such. This is an unfair expectation because we are all busy securing our own homes, helping the neighbors that were here to do the same, and preparing for evacuation, so please take care of this before you leave.

Crime Prevention Tips/Current Scams: Deputy Ralston reiterated what my previous messages have been; lock your vehicles, remove anything of value from inside them if you are leaving them outside, whether it is at your home or elsewhere. Use your home alarm. The first place thieves go once inside your house is to your bedroom because that is where most people keep jewelry, firearms, and other valuables that can be pawned/sold. Think about relocating these items to another less obvious place when you are not home. The gift card scams continue to plague us. Do not under any circumstances respond to a call from anyone for any reason to obtain gift cards. Also, the IRS will never call you and ask for money, nor will any police or local/state gov. agency. Use your caller ID on your phone, if you do not recognize the number do not answer the call. The latest scam involves thieves getting access to your car after you have used your Fob key to lock it. Lock it as soon as you get out of the car, not halfway into Walmart. New technology allows them to park nearby and somehow use equipment to re-open your car if you have distanced yourself from it after you initialized the 'lock' mechanism on the key fob – Who knew?

MOST IMPORTANTLY, "If you see something, say something". He said that we know our neighborhood better than anyone and if we see something suspicious whether it is a person or a vehicle, call 911. They will talk to the individual and make a report and send them on their way if they are legitimate. There have been many instances where they were able to catch crooks by matching fingerprints on record to reports of people they have interviewed under these circumstances, so again, don't be afraid to call the police. He said it helps them to keep our neighborhood and other communities safe.

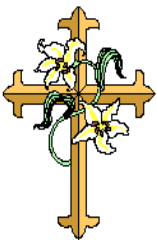

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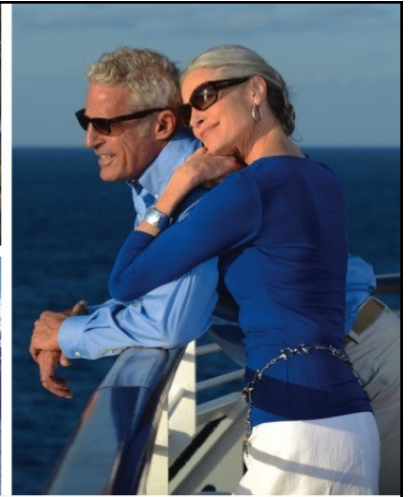

Recipe of the Month

Easter Meat Pie

- INGREDIENTS:**
- (9 inch) unbaked pie crusts
 - 2 lbs. ricotta cheese
 - 6 eggs
 - 8 oz. mozzarella cheese, grated
 - 1 lb. cooked ham, chopped
 - 1/2 lb. Genoa Salami, chopped
 - 1/4 plb. prosciutto, chopped
 - 1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese



PREPARATIONS:
 Place ricotta in a large mixing bowl and add eggs one at a time while mixing on low speed. Stir in mozzarella, ham, salami, and prosciutto until all ingredients are well combined. Line two 9 inch pans with pastry. Spoon half of mixture into each pan. Sprinkle half of the parmesan cheese over each pie, then cover with top pastry. Crimp edges and cut steam vents in tops. Bake in preheated 350° oven for 1 hour, until crust is golden brown. Cool on racks.



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
