
From the Golf Course Superintendent

As I am writing this it is 43 degrees and has been in the mid 40's and cloudy for the past few days. With these types of temperatures and weather conditions it is very common for Bermuda grass to turn an off color which looks like a purplish/brownish. The lower the mowing heights the more this will be noticed as with the Tif-Eagle Greens. This is the plant's natural defense as it is going into dormancy. Once we get a few days of sun and warmer weather the color will return. In the meantime, I will be applying foliar products, as well as pigments to help with the process and raise soil temperatures. Enjoy the golf course and I hope to see you out there.

Many of you have been asking me for recipes so starting with this issue of the Scorecard I will be posting a monthly recipe for you all to try at home. I hope you enjoy it. I am hoping once we have enough recipes on file we can write the first ever Peridia Golf and Country Club cook book.

Honey-Mustard Glazed Salmon Steaks and Fillets

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup Dijon mustard
- 1/4 cup whole-grain mustard
- 1/4 cup honey
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- 1 1/2 teaspoons finely chopped thyme
- Four 6-ounce skinless salmon fillets or 6- to 8-ounce salmon steaks (about 3/4 inch thick)
- Canola oil, for brushing
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground pepper

How to make this recipe

In a medium bowl, whisk the mustards with the honey, soy sauce, garlic and thyme.

Light a grill or preheat a grill pan and oil the grate or pan. Brush the salmon fillets with oil and season with salt and pepper. Grill the salmon fillets, skinned side down, over moderate heat for about 3 minutes. Turn and grill about 3 minutes longer, until the salmon is nearly cooked through. Generously brush both sides of the salmon with the honey mustard and grill, turning frequently, until richly glazed, about 1 minute. (For salmon steaks, grill over moderately high heat, turning once, for 4 to 5 minutes, then brush with the honey mustard, turning frequently, for 1 minute.) Transfer to a platter or plates and serve, passing the remaining honey mustard at the table.

Make ahead

The honey mustard can be refrigerated overnight.

Serve with

Steamed or grilled bok choy.

Suggested pairing

Floral, full-bodied Torrontés, a white wine from Argentina, is superb with rich, saucy seafood dishes like this salmon.

Avoid Those Phone and E-Mail Scams Requesting Money!

Once again, residents are receiving phone calls from people claiming to be "officers" from the Investigative Office of the Treasury. These individuals state that an arrest warrant has been issued for failure to respond to IRS notices. They go on to say that if the resident will make out-of-court restitution, perhaps the warrant could be cancelled. These are scams! The IRS does not call and threaten citizens and then request money. They use letters to contact taxpayers. You can look their phone number up in the phone book and call to verify that letters are in fact from them. Do not be intimidated by these heavy-handed techniques.

Calls from individuals claiming to be from a computer security company that is now handling the security of your computer and requesting money for this coverage are another popular scam. Always be suspicious of any call requesting or demanding money. Obtain as much information as possible from the caller, including contact information. Then verify that information with the Better Business Bureau, the phone directory and the company or agency they claim to represent. Notify the police if their info does not check out. Don't be scammed by unscrupulous individuals! Emails from former classmates, neighbors and relatives claiming emergencies, dire circumstances or extreme hardships while on a trip out of the country are all popular ruses from crooks. Again, verify all information with authorities or other friends or relatives before sending any money anywhere. If your grandson is really in jail, you can contact the jail independently and verify that. If someone claims to be out of the country, give them a call at home or verify that information with their other friends and neighbors. Don't let your good nature make you a target!



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
