This maintenance is necessary to get caught up on the Winter weeds as well as help the Golf Course with the amount of play we are seeing right now. With the Fairways, Tees, Collar and Approaches having Rye Grass sown into them, it makes the winter weeds extremely hard to kill without harming or killing the Rye Grassed areas. Rye Grass is in the same weed family as Poa Annua, which is the main weed that is germinating this time of year. I apologize in advance for any inconvenience. Enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.

General Manager's Column

Rule of Thumb is to always start your Scorecard article out with something positive, but this month we are in a crisis situation so I am starting out with the negative subject: "GEESE".

We are having a Goose problem here at Peridia where our Canadian friends are out there establishing their winter home. I have looked into plastic owls, dogs, hawks and even flying drones. At our Golf Advisory Committee meeting it was suggested that we set off firecrackers. I wish I had the answer to this problem but I don't, so if anyone out there has had some success from up north please stop by or e-mail your solution. Thanks!

This past month we had several functions that were sold out the first day that the Scorecard came out, so I have asked Nancy to upload the Scorecard to our web page at the same time the Scorecards are picked up by our volunteers. This will give every Member the same opportunity to sign up for our events.

The 2016 books have been closed, the financials show that the PPOA ended with a surplus of \$7,624. Our rounds were up over 2015 by 2,100. The restaurant, now open seven days a week during the season and six days a week during the off season increased its cover by 7,110 over 2015 covers. That is an increase of \$75,000 over 2015 revenues. Our department heads all did a great job in generating revenue and controlling costs. Over all, I think we have had a great 2016 and I am looking forward to another great year for 2017.

I was asked by the Golf Committee to remind our golfers to avoid stepping on the top of any bulkhead. We have had several members fall into the water on hole three and slip and fall coming off the 18th green. The combination of wet board and rubber sole is not safe, so for your safety please stay off the bulkheads when playing golf.

The new face in the pro shop is Nathan Rouiter, who comes to us from PA where he lived most of his 24 years. He graduated from the Golf Academy of America in Myrtle Beach SC in 2014. He worked at Bellewood Country Club in North Coventry PA as the assistant golf pro. Nathan is in his first year as a level one PGA Apprentice Golf Professional. Please take a minute to stop into the Pro Shop to introduce yourself and welcome Nathan to Peridia.

Please remember it is against our rules for anyone to walk a dog on the Golf Course at any time of the day or night. This is to help maintain our beautiful course but mainly for the safety of your animal. We use commercial grade pesticides that your puppy would take home and soon lick off its feet. Also, as a courtesy to our golfers, please do not dispose your doggy bags in the 17th hole trash can.

- 4. You should receive a proxy in the mail or hand delivered with the announcement of your annual meeting.
- Your component association management and officers will make sure that all proxies are filled out completely
 and that no household votes more than once. You will put your membership number on the proxy. Proxy votes
 are not confidential.
- If you prefer to vote by secret ballot for the At-Large seats, they will be available on the day and time of your component association annual meeting.
- The selection of the At-Large Directors will be by a simple majority.
- According to the Peridia By-Laws 5.02(c), "No more than two (2) Directors from any one Component Association may be elected to serve on the Master Board."

Marinated Mushrooms

Ingredients:

- 1 pound Cremini mushrooms
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup white wine vinegar
- 1/4 cup diced red onion
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 teaspoons brown sugar, packed
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon whole black peppercorns
- 1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes, optional
- 1 bay leaf
- Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper, to taste
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley leaves

Directions:


- 1. In a large pot of boiling salted water, cook mushrooms just until tender, about 3-4 minutes; drain well.
- 2. In a large bowl, combine mushrooms, olive oil, vinegar, red onion, garlic, sugar, oregano, peppercorns, red pepper flakes and bay leaf; season with salt and pepper, to taste.
- 3. Transfer to an airtight container and place in the refrigerator for at least 8 hours and up to 5 days. Serve at room temperature, garnished with parsley, if desired.


