As I am writing this it is 46 degrees and has been in the low 50's, and cloudy for the past few days. With these types of temperatures and weather conditions it is very common for Bermuda grass to turn an off color which looks like a purplish / brownish . The lower the mowing heights the more this will be noticed as with the Tif-Eagle Greens. This is the plants natural defense as it is going into dormancy. Once we get a few days of sun and warmer weather, the color will return. In the meantime I will be applying foliar products, as well as pigments to help with the process and raise soil temperatures. Enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.

General Manager's Column

The new sod and sidewalk have been completed along our property line along 45th street. We will need to start maintaining that area by cutting the grass between the wall and the side walk. I plan to have our maintenance crew start maintaining this area, sometime during the month of February. Having our crew maintain it will be a cost savings over having our outside landscaping contractor maintain it. Our entrance sign at the north end of our property, coming off 45th street, is in bad shape, I have James looking at it to see if it can be saved. I know that the flower box that surrounds the sign will need to be rebuilt.

The concrete wall along 45th is in need of a face lift, it will need to be patched and painted, the cost for materials is about \$3,500 plus our in-house labor.

It is that time to start trimming our Palm Trees on the Blvd. and on the golf course. Miguel has already started with the golf course, should be completely done with this program by the second week in February. Ray is punching holes in the greens with solid tines every two weeks, this program will continue through the winter season until he starts to aerate and pull plugs. He is planning on aerating and pulling plugs three times this summer with 5/8 tines, this will be at 6-week intervals. At the end of this cycle, he will be back to aerating with a solid tine every two weeks.

The public golf rounds were down by 2,575 and our member golf rounds were down by 240 for 2018. This was largely due to closing 9 holes for five months this last summer while Mondragon put in the new irrigation system. The f&b revenue was also affected by the lack of public play as well as the remodel of the clubhouse that took 10 days longer then the scheduled completion time.

A Deputy from the Sheriff's Office stopped by my office this past week to let me know that they will be patrolling Peridia more often because of all the complaints of speeding on Peridia Blvd. They plan on sending a car into our area once a day.

The lines and arrows leading to our speed shelves have been painted so that they are more Noticeable. We called the county to come out to paint them but after 4 weeks of trying I gave up and had James go out and paint all of the lines.

The changeover from a weir system to a cascading system has been sent back to Young Engineering with questions. Young will need to answer those questions and then resubmit the answers to SWFWMD. Update, this past Tuesday, SWFWMD gave Young Engineering the green light to submit the paper work for a new permit. Tim Dove with Young Engineering will give us an update as soon as he hears from the Tampa office.

The new fabric for the Bar stools has been delivered to the chair manufacturer, the company is in the process of hiring an upholsterer to replace the fraying material on the stools. The plan is to perform the job on site, should be finished in the next 30 to 60 days.

The manufacturer for the restaurant chairs has been made aware of our concerns with the sharp corners on the top portion of the chairs. They have not responded to our concerns nor do I expect them to address this issue. I am going to reach out to a local furniture maker to give us an idea or two in how to solve our sharp chair issue.

PERIDIA PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC. PERIDIA GOLF AND COUNTRY CLUB MONTHLY FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The financial information that has been provided in our monthly Scorecard has proved to be cumbersome, difficult to understand and may not have provided sufficient information as to the financial condition of the Association and the significant activity within the Association's Capital Reserve Fund. The Board of Directors and the General Manager, with the advice of the Financial Advisory Committee, are working on the development of a new Scorecard Financial Summary to better portray the finances of the Association.

Unfortunately the new Summary is not available for inclusion in the February, 2019 Scorecard. Rather than include the old format in the Scorecard, the following are the financial highlights for the period of January – December, 2018:

Operations:

Revenue	\$3,596,818
Expenses	3,641,647
Net Income/(Loss)	\$ (44,829)

The results of 2018 were a net loss to the Association of \$44,829. Although expenses were controlled as much as possible, revenue was less than expected due to the following reasons:

- Clubhouse being closed longer than expected due to the remodeling project
- Reduced public play on the golf course as a result of nine holes being closed for more than expected for the installation of the new irrigation system.

It is important to know that Management and the Board of Directors provided funding for this 2018 loss in the 2019 budget.

Our Cash and Investments remain strong with a total of \$1,241,339 (\$371,632 for Operations and \$869,707 for the Capital Reserve Fund). The major capital projects for 2018 were:

- Clubhouse Remodeling \$301,682
- Golf Course Irrigation System \$670,977
- Kitchen Equipment Purchases \$ 87,588

All of the ending balances are subject to change pending an annual independent audit. The results will be available at the next annual meeting.

Once the new Financial Summary has been completed, reviewed and approved, we plan to include the 2018 results and current results in a future Scorecard.
