

#### **General Manager's Column**

GREAT night was had by all on New Year's Eve!! We had a full house of members and guests enjoying themselves as they rang in the New Year. This was our third year in a row that this event was sold out. Thank You all for ending 2018 with a bang.

Coyotes have been spotted around # 7 tee in the last couple of weeks, so please be aware of your surroundings when letting your pets out in your back yards for their bathroom break. Safest way to protect your pets would be to walk them on a short leash when they need to go out.

As our members come back from up north, they make a point to stop by the office to ask questions about some of the programs, special events and issues that we came up during the summer months. So, what I thought I might do with this month's Scorecard is try to answer a couple of those questions.

**QUESTION:** Mondays, are you going to continue having Monday Madness with Chef Bites during the season?

**ANSWER:** Absolutely, Monday Madness will continue as long as our members keep supporting this activity. What I see on Mondays are a lot of happy members coming together to relax after a stressful weekend while enjoying a drink or two. The food is no longer free, there is a \$5 charge which allows the Chef to put out a larger spread so that our members can have some lite bites for their dinner. The Clubhouse is full of energy from the time of the first arrival 3:30 to the time of the last to leave 6:15PM. It's working so we plan to continue having Monday Madness.

**QUESTION:** Will the Tiki Bar be open during the cold months?

**ANSWER:** Yes! Larry and Carla are both looking forward to providing their specialty drinks, the full lunch menu, entertainment and their bad jokes. We plan to continue our Sunday live music once each month from 3:30 to 5:30. Check your Scorecard for which Sunday we have entertainment. We are going to open the Tiki Bar at 1:00PM each day so that you can enjoy the full lunch menu while taking in the sun.

**QUESTION:** Are we going to have another short fall for 2018.

**ANSWER:** Yes, we will be coming up short on our revenue for Golf and Food. This past summer our Golf Course had 9 holes closed for a total of sixteen weeks to put in our new irrigation system. During that time, we lost most of our public play because of only having 9 holes open. With the additional 19 rain days that shut down the Course, we are going to have a short fall in our golf revenue for 2018. When your rounds are down, your food sales will also be down and with the restaurant remodel taking four weeks instead of three weeks help caused additional loss in F&B revenues. To offset that short fall your Board and Management budgeted in 2019 a line item to recover this short fall. So, there will **NOT** be an assessment for the 2018's revenue shortfall.

#### **President's Blog**

#### "Happy 2019, Peridia"

Peridia Golf and Country Club is still in the middle of construction. 45th Street, the apartments, a housing development across from Garden Lakes, and many other sights keep popping up near our community. Take John Marble Park for instance.

"MANATEE COUNTY – Residents who use John Marble Park's swimming pool, playground and other amenities are getting a say in how Manatee County can improve the recreational asset.

The Parks and Natural Resources Department is conducting an **online survey** asking residents what facilities they use at the park named after a late director of the parks department and what features they would like to see added to the spacious, shaded property at the northwest corner of State Road 70 and 37th Street East.

In 1995, the county acquired the facility from a struggling neighborhood association.

For several years, the YMCA provided programs there before the county was able to staff it.

When voters approved a half-cent sales tax in 2016, the county slated the park for more than \$3 million of that future revenue to replace the aging gymnasium and tennis courts, build a new pavilion with restrooms, expand the pool deck, repave the parking lot and do other improvements.

County staff are suggesting other additions such as eventually including a dog park, pickleball court, splash pad and new basketball courts.

A recent open house and the ongoing **online survey** are "a chance for the public to influence the final design" of Marble Park's upcoming renovation, Parks Recreation Manager Matt Porter said in a recent announcement.

residents what hours they are likely to use the recreation center, what programs for youth and adults it should offer, how often they are likely to visit the park, what amenities they currently use and what features should be added."

#### Identity Theft – Protect Yourself, know what to do

Identity theft is a federal crime. It occurs when someone uses your personal information without your knowledge or permission for financial or other gain. Typical identity theft involves a thief stealing your personal information to pose as you in some way. A newer and growing variety is called synthetic identity theft which means your personal information is combined with fake data to create a brand new, bogus identity. This type of identity theft is harder to detect. There are several steps you can take to lower your risks. Your personal information is only as secure as the least secure way it is stored or disclosed. A sampling of traditional tactics that thieves continue to use is as follows:

**Mail Theft** – Place outgoing mail into a postal mailbox and use a locking personal mailbox if possible, or make sure you retrieve your mail as soon as possible after delivery.

**Purse or wallet snatching** – Minimize what you carry in your wallet, especially credit cards. Never carry your social security card unless it is absolutely necessary.

Stay away from scams – Watch or read the news to become aware of the most recent scams. The Federal Trade Commission offers information and tips on current scams. Go to consumer.ftc.gov and click on the "Alerts" link. Never reply to messages asking for personal information, whether the message is sent over the phone or by email, text or through an ad. Give only to established charities. You can check a charity's trustworthiness at give.org, the Better Business Bureau's Wise Giving Alliance site.

Guard your Cards – safely store credit cards when they are not in use. Memorize your card PINs, make a list of your card account numbers, expiration dates and customer service phone numbers and keep the list in a secure place that you can access quickly if your cards are lost or stolen. Check your card activity and bank accounts regularly. Assign just one credit card for online purchases. Before you create an online account, shop or enter personal information on a website, check for signs that the organization and the site are secure and trustworthy. Look for security indicators, such as the "https" at the beginning of the web address that indicates the page uses a secure form of encryption to protect the information you enter. Most browsers use other security indicators such as a symbol, such as a 'padlock' or a color change.

Look into identity theft protection services – many companies, including the credit reporting companies, offer identity theft protection services on a subscription basis for a fee. They help you monitor your accounts and provide alerts to suspicious activity and may include other forms of assistance

If you become a victim, call any business where you know fraud took place and ask for the fraud dept. Place an initial fraud alert on your files by contacting one of the three major US credit reporting companies to report yourself as a victim of identity theft. That reporting company must tell the other two. The three credit reporting companies are Equifax, Experian and Trans Union. Order a credit report and file a complaint with the FTC. Identitytheft.gov is the FTC's website that will provide you with a "Memo to Law Enforcement" that explains the meaning, purpose and importance of the report to the police. Then file a police report and provide that document to them as well as any other proof you may have.
