This is the time for our maintenance season to kick in as well, so please make sure you look at the schedule posted in the Golf Shop for closure dates and times.

The PLGA will be starting on Mondays at 8:30AM and will have regular tee times. The Golf Course will be closed on Tuesday every week for the summer months. Please call the Golf Shop if you have any questions.

For those members still here who play golf in the summertime, please make sure you stop in the Golf Shop to pick up your list of golf courses that we have a reciprocal agreement with. These are courses outside of Peridia that you can play for a discounted greens fee. Please make sure you look at each course's ground rules for making tee times.

Etiquette 101: This month I would like to talk about etiquette on the putting green. Players should not stand on another player's line of putt or, when making a stroke, cast a shadow over the line of putt. Players should remain on or close to the putting green until all other players in the group have holed out.

Golf Course Watch: This is the time of year we have more light in a day and people seem to find their way on the Course after hours. If you see anyone playing golf on the Golf Course after hours, please call the Golf Shop. There shouldn't be anyone on the Course playing golf after the flags have been pulled. Thank You!!

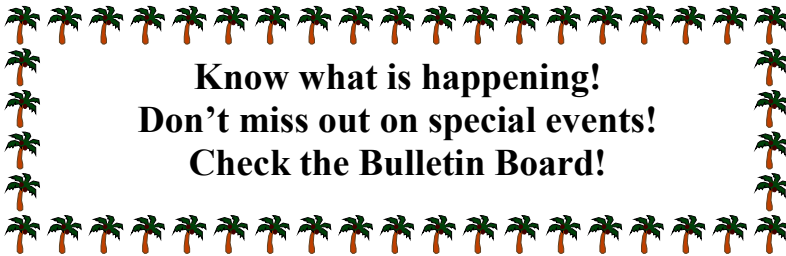

From the Golf Course Superintendent

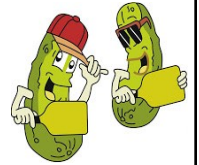

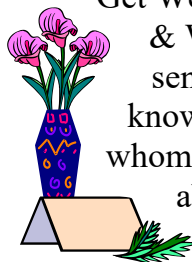

President's Blog

Tom Donato asked me if I had any goals for Peridia now that I've been President for a month. As a matter of fact, I do.

The biggest item to tackle will be to secure the updating of our Peridia documents. At the Annual Meeting this past April, members asked several questions showing their concerns about making changes. A committee will begin planning a process to help members learn what changes the Board is proposing and why.

The last time our documents were amended was in 2007, when Dick Lovelace was President. From the research I've done, we should be revising the docs every 5 – 7 years. Why? I'm glad you asked!

1. To eliminate obsolete provisions.
2. To eliminate provisions no longer observed or enforced.
3. To eliminate provisions that conflict with current laws.
4. To improve poorly drafted documents by clarifying ambiguous provisions.
5. To give the Peridia Property Owners Association's Board of Directors the proper framework for governing.
6. To give the 7 Component Associations' members confidence that the documents accurately describe members' rights, legal procedures, etc.

None of the current Board Directors are lawyers. We realize that making accurate changes requires a degree of expertise, which can only be provided by a legal specialist, that is, an attorney who specializes in the drafting of HOA documents.

I've read and reread Peridia's Docs.

1. Master Declaration of Covenants, Conditions and Restrictions for Peridia
2. The Articles of Incorporation
3. The Bylaws

All three documents require 70% member vote to be amended, changed, or revised.

It's a huge task. As an ex-teacher, I think 70% is an average grade. But getting an amended set of Docs is an A+. If we work together helping our fellow members get on board with the needed changes, we can do it. At this point, Lovelace is my idol.

General Manager's Column

Those of you that follow the BOD meetings know that we will be closing the Golf Course and the Restaurant on Tuesdays (only) starting June 7 for 16 weeks and re-open the Golf Course and the Restaurant on September 27. This is a very big change in past operations and I want to thank the Ladies Golf Association for giving up their Tuesday and moving to Mondays for this time period. Ray will be using Tuesdays to schedule most all of his summers' maintenance. This will give him all day without interference from our golfers when he goes to aerify greens, verticut greens, sand greens, fertilize the golf course, spray insecticide and spray herbicide on the whole Golf Course.

Benefits of closing the Golf Course one day a week for 16 weeks during the summer season:

1. Greens have an opportunity to rest
2. Ray can schedule maintenance projects on the days that we are closed
3. Chemicals that Ray applies can be watered in without trying to water around players
4. Golfers won't track chemicals off to outer area before Ray has a chance to water in the chemical
5. Tees will have a day to rest
6. Ray will have time to work on the tee boxes without working around the golfers
7. Ray won't have to put off regular maintenance which he has to do when he is trying to get his projects done during half-day closings
8. Cuts his overtime down
9. During the summer months his crew is cutting grass every day. Working with a closed day gives a day for maintenance projects without the demand to get the Golf Course ready for play

Benefits of closing the Restaurant for 16 Tuesdays during the summer season:

1. We save \$2,400 on Clubhouse cleaning because you are closed for 16 days.
2. We save \$12,160 on Clubhouse labor because you are closed for 16 days.
3. Additional miscellaneous savings linen, electric, gas, cleaning supplies and so on.
4. Monday golf revenue will increase by having the ladies move to Mondays, \$9,600.
5. Monday's restaurant revenue will increase by having the ladies move to Mondays, \$3,800.
6. So by closing on Tuesday we will see a savings in expenses of about \$16,000 over the sixteen weeks. And the closing will not affect our revenue because our Tuesday income shifts to Mondays.

Cons for closing the Golf Course for 16 Tuesdays during the summer:

1. Ladies Golf Association will need to move to Mondays.

Again I want to thank the Ladies for stepping up and giving their Club their day.

Remember, I always have time for your questions or comments, so please stop by my office. My door is always open.

Rosemary Ranch Chicken Kabobs

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup olive oil
- 1/2 cup ranch dressing
- 3 tablespoons Worcestershire sauce
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh rosemary
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon white vinegar
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper, or to taste
- 1 tablespoon white sugar, or to taste (optional)
- 5 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves - cut into 1 inch cubes

Directions

1. In a medium bowl, stir together the olive oil, ranch dressing, Worcestershire sauce, rosemary, salt, lemon juice, white vinegar, pepper, and sugar. Let stand for 5 minutes. Place chicken in the bowl, and stir to coat with the marinade. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes.
2. Preheat the grill for medium-high heat. Thread chicken onto skewers and discard marinade. Lightly oil the grill grate. Grill skewers for 8 to 12 minutes, or until the chicken is no longer pink in the center, and the juices run clear.

Homeowners in Manatee County are receiving letters from companies offering to sell them a copy of their deed and property assessment profile. The cost is \$50 or \$100 per deed. The Manatee County Clerk's Office wants homeowners to know that deeds can be found on the clerk's website and can be printed at no charge. If a certified copy is needed, they can be obtained from the clerk's office typically for less than \$5.

While the mailed offer is not illegal, it offers a service that is not necessary and is expensive. The Manatee County Clerk's Office can be contacted at 741-4040 or by email at clerkscopycenter@ManateeClerk.com.

Please note that any "offer" of a public document or government service for a fee may be unnecessary and may be free from the source. Always check with the governmental entity before paying someone else to "help" you out!

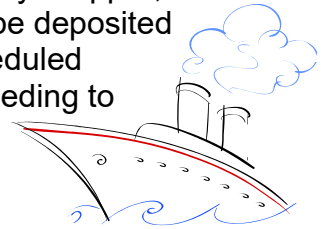
