From the Golf Course Superintendent

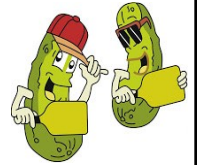

After this El-Nino weather we are receiving, I for one am ready for Spring and the green-up it brings. There was a pre-emergent herbicide and fertilizer application applied to the Golf Course in mid February. The analysis that was applied is activated by microbial activity, which is all controlled by weather. The more we warm up the more the turf will respond, green-up, grow and produce lush conditions. Along with the green-up you will notice a lot of herbicide spot spraying. This is done in an effort to control any late Winter or Spring weeds which are germinating. I apologize for any inconvenience from the course maintenance. Enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.

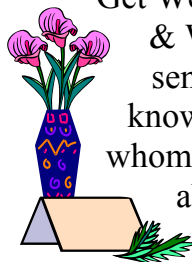

General Manager's Column

March 2016

The month of February has been "HUGE!!!" with all of the member activities here at the Club. ROASTED CHICKEN WITH SPRING VEGETABLES

3 1/2 pounds skin-on, bone-in chicken quarters

Kosher salt and freshly ground pepper

1 lemon, halved

3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil

1 pound fingerling or other small potatoes

2 bunches radishes

1 bunch scallions

1 bunch baby carrots

1/4 cup chopped fresh dill

Directions:

Preheat the oven to 500 degrees F. Rinse the chicken and pat dry. Season with salt and pepper, then place skin-side up on a rimmed baking sheet. Squeeze 1/2 lemon over the chicken and drizzle with 1 tablespoon olive oil. Roast 15 minutes.

Meanwhile, cut the potatoes and radishes in half and cut the scallions into thirds. Toss the potatoes, radishes, carrots and the remaining 2 tablespoons olive oil into a bowl; season with salt and pepper.

Remove the chicken from the oven and scatter the vegetables around it. Continue to roast until the vegetables are tender and the chicken is golden and cooked through, about 20 more minutes. Squeeze the remaining 1/2 lemon over the chicken and vegetables. Top with the dill and season with salt.

Avoiding the Risk of Burglary

Recent burglaries in Peridia make this a good time to review the steps you can take to keep from being a victim. Take a few minutes and check every door and window to be sure the locking mechanism is in good working order. Consider the use of dowels between window sills and the top of the window to prevent windows being forced open. Various locking devices are available at the hardware that serve the same purpose. Use dowels in doorwall tracks or plastic flaps that adhere to one doorwall panel where it meets the other panel and when folded down, prevent the door from being opened. Insert a block of wood or a screw extending down from the top of the doorwall which does not impede the movement of the door but prevents it from being lifted out of the track and removed for entry.

If you have an alarm, use it whenever you go out, even for just a short time. If you do not have an alarm, consider getting one or at least put up a sign saying that you do have an alarm. You can also buy a device that emits barking dog noises when activated by motion. Consider leaving a radio or TV and lights on when you go out. Consider leaving exterior lights on at night.

If leaving for a period of time, use timers on lights in various rooms. Let a neighbor know you are leaving and ask the police for vacation drive-bys.

As always, be alert to your surroundings. If you see a person or a car that appears to be out of place, CALL 911! If you see someone park a car in a common area and then wander off in an unexpected direction, consider it suspicious and CALL 911. If you see someone around a neighbor's house when you know they are not home, CALL 911. Be especially alert between 6 and 9 PM as at least several of the recent robberies have occurred at that time.

Last, but not least, should you be a victim of a burglary, please notify the police! If something is stolen from your vehicle, yard, garage or home, the police need to be aware of this activity. It helps them know where burglars are operating, gives them your contact information should they recover stolen property, and alerts them to our need for more police patrols in this area.
