Please mark your calendars for our annual Member Memorial Day Golf Scramble on May 30, 2016. This will be a 4-person scramble with a shotgun start at 8:30AM. Golf Etiquette Section: This month I want to talk about Blue Flag rules and regulations. Golf Carts that use blue flags may drive to within 10 feet in front of the greens and tee boxes. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and the next tee box except on holes 7, 8 and 18 where you may drive on the rough to the tee markers. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and sand traps. Also, no blue flags will be issued when cart path only is in effect. Driving carts too close to greens and tees will result in compaction problems. We want to keep Peridia and its Golf Course in great condition and this is one way to do that.

Last minute reminders for all of you members leaving us for the summer. Please check your trunk, garages, and golf bags for any extra range balls that you may have. Please return them to the Golf Shop before you leave. Again, I want to thank everyone for a special Winter Season. You made all of our jobs in the Golf Shop and Cart Barn fun experiences. Please be safe on your travels back home, and see you back at Peridia in the fall.



MASTER BOARD ANNOUNCEMENT

In an effort to maintain quality and safety as well as the best service possible to all our residents, the Master Board has established the following policy:


- 1. All residents with an outstanding balance remaining on their minimum can contact the Food and Beverage Manager to place any order larger than fifty dollars before May 15. These orders will be treated like an event and must be received seven days before requested day of pickup.
- 2. Raw food will not be available for to-go orders or any order, i.e. uncooked steaks/raw meat.
- 3. We do not have a package goods license for alcoholic beverages and by law cannot offer this as an option.

This policy will allow for the Chef and the F&B Manager to plan and order supplies for larger orders without shorting the dining membership each day.

CREAMY SMOKED SALMON PASTA

"This is a lighter version of pasta carbonara. For people who want the flavor but not the bacon, smoked salmon is the perfect substitute!"

Ingredients:

- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 onion, finely chopped
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 2 cups skim milk
- 1/2 cup grated Romano cheese
- 1 cup frozen green peas, thawed and drained
- 1/2 cup canned mushrooms, drained
- 10 ounces smoked salmon, chopped
- 1 (16 ounce) package penne pasta

Directions

Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook for 8 to 10 minutes or until al dente; drain. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Sauté onion in butter until tender.

Stir flour and garlic powder into the butter and onions. Gradually stir in milk. Heat to just below boiling point, and then gradually stir in cheese until the sauce is smooth. Stir in peas and mushrooms and cook over low heat for 4 minutes.

- Keep security in mind when using your device and think twice before opening an email or a link when you are unfamiliar with the sender.


Enticing links to viruses and destructive software (called malware) can be transmitted through text messaging from unknown numbers. Some hackers imitate legitimate contacts to lure users.

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Recipe of the Month

Corned Beef Hash

INGREDIENTS:

2 Tbs. ve getable oil

8 ounces cooked corned beef, diced

1 white onion, finely chopped

4Tbs. unsalted butter

4 large eggs

Koshersalt and freshly ground pepper

2 medium baking potatoes, peeled 4 slices cheddar cheese (about 2 ounces) DIR ECTIONS: Heat the oil in a medium skillet over high heat. Add the comed beef and shredded (about 2 cups

and cook, stirring with a wooden spoon until it releases some fat and browns slightly. Stir in the onion, bell pepper and potatoes and cook, undisturbed until brown and crisp on the bottom. Continue cooking, turning the hash as it browns evenly. Place the cheese slices on top of the hash, reduce the heat and let it sit until the cheese melts, about 1 minute. To serve, top each portion of hash with a fried egg.
