Golf Etiquette Section: This month I want to talk about Blue Flag rules and regulations. Golf Carts that use blue flags may drive to within 10 feet in front of the greens and tee boxes. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and the next tee box except on holes 7, 8 and 18 where you may drive on the rough to the tee markers. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and sand traps. Also, no blue flags will be issued when cart path only is in effect. Driving carts too close to greens and tees will result in compaction problems. We want to keep Peridia and its Golf Course in great condition and this is one way to do that.

Last minute reminders for all of you members leaving us for the summer. Please check your trunk, garages, and golf bags for any extra range balls that you may have. Please return them to the Golf Shop before you leave. Again, I want to thank everyone for a special Winter Season. You made all of our jobs in the Golf shop and Cart Barn a fun experience. Please be safe on your travels back home and see you back at Peridia in the fall.



President's Blog

All for one and one for all was the motto of <u>The Three Musketeers</u>, the famous French soldiers, in a book by the nineteenth-century French author Alexandre Dumas. At Peridia it refers to idea that all members of our community support each of the individual members, and the individual members support the Peridia community.



Peridia Property Owners Association is a Social Welfare Organization. As described in Internal Revenue Code (IRC) section **501(c)(4)**, we are an HOA organization **not** structured for **profit** but operated exclusively to promote social welfare. We are members at Peridia Golf and Country Club. When individual families purchased in Peridia they understood they'd have to share the common expenses for running the Club, the tennis courts, the community pool, the Golf Course, and the common grounds, etc., to enjoy all the amenities that they couldn't afford on their own. We often discuss issues and make decisions that appear to affect only a few members or only one component yet benefit the community as a whole. Master Board Directors must keep that in mind as we endeavor to preserve Peridia as an attractive social community for current and future members, and as the Premiere Executive Golf and Country Club in Bradenton, Fl.

Peridia is an established community that provides a wonderful life style for us all. Continuing that quality of life for the future requires us to be "All for one, and one for all."

<u>One</u> for all, Bill Handy, Master Board President

Dear Peridia Resident,

Loretto Sadkin, past Master Board President, has been our point person on the 45^{th} Street Committee for several years. She has met and discussed with Manatee County Officials the concerns of Peridia Members from Patio 6 from Raintree and Peridia Patio HOA for the big homes along Kilty Court. She has often given reports at monthly Master Board Meetings, as the 45^{th} Street Construction will affect all Peridia Home Owners to some extent.

Sadkin recently expressed concern about "Misinformation" she's been hearing about the 45th Street Project as it's being discussed at the club. I have asked her to once again be the "Fact Checker" for the 45th Street to deter Fake News, as she knows all the necessary County Executives that will provide the accurate information.

If you have any questions or hear disturbing information that you feel is incorrect, please don't pass on 45th Street misrepresentations. Instead email your question to Bill Handy at whandy2@tampabay.rr.com and I'll pass it on to Loretto Sadkin. Please include your Name, phone number and email address so I can get back to you as quickly as possible.

Finally, here's a list of several facts that Loretto wants us all to know.

- Project status Report from Public Works: 100% design plans completed and necessary permits acquired. Invitations for Bid documents are completed and being sent out. Construction tentatively to begin Summer/Fall of 2017 and will take 18 to 22 months to complete.
- Light poles will be staggered on both sides of 45th St and will be placed every 155 ft. Light shields will be installed to reduce side light throw by 50%. Side light shields will prevent residents from seeing the lamps from their houses.
- 3. Rubberized binder will be added to Friction Course Asphalt to minimize road noise.
- 4. County will install "No truck traffic " signs at all Peridia entrances.
- Emergency traffic lights will be installed at fire station.
- 6. Due to the unspecified cost of wall and long term plant maintenance including the responsibility to install an irrigation system, maintenance of said system, and watering fees, the Master Board previously determined not to sign a temporary construction easement, (TCE), accepting the County's offer to provide plants along the wall. As a result, the county feels no obligation to offer plants.
- The Temporary Construction Easements, (TCE), which required signatures by
 every homeowner along the wall, were also not completed. As a result, no
 construction equipment will be parked on the Peridia side of the street.

Creamy Smoked Salmon Pasta

This is a lighter version of pasta carbonara. For people who want the flavor but not the bacon, smoked salmon is the perfect substitute!"

Ingredients

- 6 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 onion, finely chopped
- 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons garlic powder
- 2 cups skim milk
- 1/2 cup grated Romano cheese
- 1 cup frozen green peas, thawed and drained
- 1/2 cup canned mushrooms, drained
- 10 ounces smoked salmon, chopped
- 1 (16 ounce) package penne pasta

Directions

- 1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook for 8 to 10 minutes or until al dente; drain.
- 2. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Sauté onion in butter until tender.
- 3. Stir flour and garlic powder into the butter and onions. Gradually stir in milk. Heat to just below boiling point, and then gradually stir in cheese until the sauce is smooth. Stir in peas and mushrooms, and cook over low heat for 4 minutes.
- 4. Toss in smoked salmon, and cook for 2 more minutes. Serve over pasta.

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
