Golf Etiquette Section: This month I want to talk about Blue Flag rules and regulations. Golf Carts that use blue flags may drive to within 10 feet in front of the greens and tee boxes. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and the next tee box except on holes 7, 8 and 18 where you may drive on the rough to the tee markers. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and sand traps. Also, no blue flags will be issued when cart path only is in effect. Driving carts too close to greens and tees will result in compaction problems. We want to keep Peridia and its Golf Course in great condition and this is one way to do that.

Last minute reminder's for all of you members leaving us for the summer. Please check your trunk, garages, and golf bags for any extra range balls that you may have. Please return them to the Golf Pro Shop before you leave. Again, I want to thank everyone for a special Winter Season. You made all of our jobs in the Golf Pro Shop and Cart Barn a fun experience. Please be safe on your travels back home and see you back at Peridia in the fall.



Ending balances subject to change before Annual Meeting

Dear Member,

Peridia had a difficult financial year in 2017, with unanticipated expenses, reduced income, inclement and hot weather, a visit from Hurricane Irma, and a drainage problem at the weir. We ended the year with a financial deficiency. That's not what any of us wanted. The Board finally decided how they would handle the cash shortage.



The Board of Directors had been studying and planning how to cover a shortfall of operational funds from 2017 and the cost of refurbishing the weir which filters our lake water before it exits Peridia. I know members were hoping to hear about our plans at the April 9, 2018, Annual Meeting, but we hadn't decided how to handle these financial needs until the April 23, Master Board Meeting.

As 2017 ended, some 2018 operational funds were used to help resolve the year end shortfall, thus making the 2018 Budget inadequate causing a Cash Flow shortage of \$148,907. At the meeting a Board motion was made and seconded to add \$229.44 to each owner's 2018 assessment. That calculates to \$114.72 to be added to each of the remaining two quarterly payments. After much discussion it passed unanimously.

Next, we tackled the \$44,910 cost of repairing the weir. We paid this expense by borrowing from current capital funds. A pair of plans was discussed, followed by a motion to replace the cost of repairing the weir to this year's capital contribution. It too passed unanimously. It was determined that an additional \$69.20 would be added to each owner's yearly dues, or \$34.60 per quarter. Adding the shortfall together with the weir repair you will see \$149.32 on each quarterly statement.

The Board Meeting lasted longer than most because of these two topics. The attending members were patient as the Board discussed each item, and then had full opportunity to share their concerns on both agenda items. It was a productive meeting, plus it was nice to hear all the support for the decisions the Board made.

I thank you for your understanding as we amend the 2018 budget. We have already started off in the first 3 months of 2018 with revenue exceeding budget by \$25,016 and we will be controlling our expenses as the slow months approach. Please continue to enjoy your club's amenities. We need you!

General Manager's Column

March was another healthy month for our Club operations, our revenues exceeded budget in Golf and Food by \$18,966. With the help from miscellaneous income we ended the month with total revenues of \$386,887 exceeding budget by \$19,824. Cost of Sales Sold came in over budget by (\$616) and total expenses for March were over budget by (\$8,322). March's **Net** income beat budget by \$11,502.

Last week's Hot Dog Fest for the whole membership was okay. The weather did not co-operate as I had planed but we had 310 members buy a hot dog or brat. My target was 500, so the windy and cool conditions kept some of our members at home.

The Club House committee met with Sarah Colandor, the design specialist from Fawley Bryant, to start looking at colors, carpet samples, fabric samples and table tops for our face lift in September. I think that it was a very productive meeting, we came out of the meeting agreeing on color, carpet sample and table tops. We narrowed down the selection of chairs to 2 and the selection of fabric to 4, all in all a very good meeting. Next meeting will be scheduled when the chair samples arrive in 3 weeks.

On the Golf Course James and Frank have re-finished all of the benches that were in need of some paint. James replaced the tops of all of the bulkheads that were warped or broken. The new flags for each of the holes have come in and are out on all 18 holes. We have some tree trimming to get done, please be patient we will get that done during the summer months.

The work has started on the front entrance to the Clubhouse parking lot, it will take about 5 days to complete. This work is part of the capital projects approved by the BOD last November. The cost for the asphalt is \$15,200 and will be completed by the end of April.

The main irrigation line for the front entrance and down the center of Peridia Blvd. has been repaired at no cost to Peridia. This irrigation line was cut by the utility company that was hooking up the sewer system for the new apartments that are going up at the front entrance. We had our irrigation company Mondragon do the repairs and we have arranged with Kelly Frye to pay this invoice.

Hats and t-shirts have become a big issue in recent months and now the BOD has asked that the staff start enforcing the dress code. That means NO TEE SHIRTS IN THE CLUBHOUSE DAY OR NIGHT and GENTLEMEN NO HATS IN THE RESTAURANT PERIOD AND PLEASE REMOVE YOUR HATS AFTER 5:00PM IN THE BAR AREA. If you want to wear hats and t-shirt you are welcome to join Larry at the Tiki Bar. Please follow the rules so that you won't be embarrassed when asked to PUT ON A COLLARED SHIRT AND/OR ASKED TO REMOVE YOUR HAT IN THE RESTAURANT AREA AND IN THE BAR AREA AFTER 5:00PM.

Our Monday closings will start on May 21 and run for sixteen weeks, re-opening on September 10. Our first aerification will be that same day May 21. This will be with three quarter inch Tines and we will be pulling the cores, filling the holes with fertilizer and sand.

The irrigation project for the entire Golf Course will start on June 4; the target for completion is also September 10. If it all goes as planned, we will be opening all 18 holes at that time.

Finally, we had planned to give our Clubhouse a face-lift a year ago, but the capital funds were too tight. With an additional year of added funds, the restaurant committee decided to "Git R done". With the help of Fawley Bryant, a professional architecture and design firm, it will be completed for September in time for the return of our favorite snowbirds.



MASTER BOARD ANNOUNCEMENT

In an effort to maintain quality and safety as well as the best service possible to all our residents, the Master Board has established the following policy:

- 1. All residents with an outstanding balance remaining on their minimum can contact the Food and Beverage Manager to place any order larger than 3 meals before May 15. These orders will be treated like an event and must be received four days before requested day of pickup.
- 2. Raw food will not be available for to-go orders or any order, i.e. uncooked steaks/raw meat.
- 3. We do not have a package goods license for alcoholic beverages and by law cannot offer this as an option.

This policy will allow for the Chef and the F&B Manager to plan and order supplies for larger orders without shorting the dining membership each day.

What is "Suspicious Activity" and Preventing Car Theft By: Pam Wallace, Chairman, Peridia Crimewatch Committee

Have you ever wondered what is suspicious, or what to do if you did see something suspicious? It's not the person that is suspicious, but the behavior that they are displaying that is. The following examples are things that would be suspicious activity.

- Someone walking down the street late at night with a backpack wearing dark clothing, possibly pulling on car door handles (Burglar).
- A vehicle parked and idling with its lights off with someone inside or driving through a neighborhood with its lights off late at night (Burglar).
- Someone ringing your doorbell looking for someone that you don't know or doesn't live there. They apologize and then walk away. They may get into their vehicle and drive away, or they may go onto other houses knocking on doors as well (Burglary).
- Someone that is constantly looking around an area looking at the security of a store or lingering in blind spot of a retail location (Theft).
- Someone that is following a delivery truck and they are seen walking up to a residence right after a delivery is made (Porch Pirate).

These are all examples of suspicious activity that should be reported to law enforcement immediately by dialing 911. 911 is the fastest way to get a deputy or officer to respond to something that is occurring right now. Don't post suspicious activity on social media but call 911 and give us the best description possible. Never confront suspicious activity as your safety is paramount. It's never a burden and no activity is too minor for a deputy to respond to.

In March we had two car thefts in Peridia; both were taken from outside the home and at least one was unlocked with the key fob left inside. One vehicle was recovered the next day. I do not know the details of the other one, only that it was stolen. 52% of all crime reports in Manatee Co. are vehicle burglaries, and 12% are vehicle theft. Both of these crimes are highly preventable, simply by protecting your vehicle in such a way as to deter the crime from happening. The most secure method is to put your car in the garage. Spring is a great time of year to clean out the garage and make room for your vehicle. Always lock your car and take the keys inside. Utilize outside lighting at night, such as flood lights that come on when there is movement. The thieves do not want to be seen or captured on camera, if you have them.

To our neighbors heading home for the summer, make sure that a neighbor has your contact information and that you have secured your residence and prepared it for Hurricane season.


