The weather is starting to warm up and with this I will be incorporating our Spring/Summer maintenance schedule. We will start vertical mowing, grooming, spiking, light top dressing on a weekly basis and applying pesticides on a more frequent basis to the greens. These practices are needed to insure healthy greens. We are also back to our weekly mowing of the lake banks and rough areas. The rye grass on the fairways, collars and approaches is turning brown and dying off.

This is known as transition. The areas where rye grass was applied heavy, the transition will be more severe. We will also be applying herbicides and other cultural practices to help with the transition from the Rye back to the Bermuda grass. I apologize in advance for any inconvenience, enjoy the Golf Course and I hope to see you out there.



General Manager's Corner

This month I thought I would use this manager's corner to update you on our major projects that are taking place around Peridia.

Clubhouse Acoustics: At last month's meeting, I reported that R.J. Walker, Acoustic Consultants, recommended hanging 12 - 2"x 2'x 4" acoustic boards around the angled wood ceiling area in our main dining area. After that meeting I went online and found the same acoustic board for \$5.00 per square foot, so I ordered a sample. I then reached out to a company called TechLite. They have a product that they call the Mini Wave Panel, which is made of an acoustic material and it can be hung from the ceiling or on the walls. Both samples were displayed at the April BOD meeting where the BOD suggested purchasing a decibel meter to take readings before and after installing the acoustic boards. We are seeking advice from a number of members that are or were in the sound business.

Pool Repair: The pool filtering system repair is scheduled for mid-July. The pool will be closed for 3 weeks and at that time we are planning to fix the cracks and paint the pool deck. The step up around the pool will be painted a darker color so that our members will see the elevation change. Our plan is to update our Tiki Bar during the three-week closing. Most of that upgrade will happen because of our good friend Ron Martin.

Summer Closings: Our Summer closings will start on Tuesday, May 14th and continue thru September 10th opening back up on Tuesday, September 17th. This means that the restaurant, bar and Tiki Bar will be closed each Tuesday during this period. The Golf Course will also be closed for maintenance each Tuesday during that same time period right after the PLGA and the Putters finish playing golf. This gives Ray time to work on the Golf Course without trying to work around golfers. The Golf Course will have 4 to 5 additional days that it will be closed due to deep core aerifications and nematode applications.

Electrical Upgrade: I have been asked to revisit the scope of work with Doyle electric to make sure that we have a safe environment around the deteriorating main box that holds 800 amps of power. The engineer from Doyle Electric evaluated the box and said that sometime in the future the county inspector will probably red tag the box and allow us only 30 days to correct the problem. So, I have asked Doyle to give us a quote to replace the whole electrical area making it safe and giving the building ample power. Also, in his quote there are additional costs for drawings and permitting which were not in the first quote. Doyle has scheduled the work to be done during the first week of June. The electricity will be off for 2 days, while the panels are being replaced.

Cart Waiver: Just over a year ago, I started requiring the Golf Pro Shop to start asking for golfers to sign a waiver releasing the Club of liability in cases of bodily injuries and putting the responsibility on the leaser to pay for all damages to the cart. Instead of having our members sign each time they go out to play golf, Brian and I have tweaked the wavier so that our members can sign a one-time release. This release will go into their file and will be good for as long as they are members of Peridia. You can find this form inside this month's Scorecard and is available in the Golf Pro Shop. Please take a minute to sign and return it to the office or Golf Pro shop. Driving/riding will not be permitted without a signed waiver on file.

Remember, I always have time for your questions or comments, so please stop by my office. My door is always open.

President's Blog:

When we first moved to Peridia, we thought Spanish moss was pretty. It's the thick, drooping, grey "hair" that hangs from so many of the trees on our golf course. We even took a few strands off a tree and added it to a potted plant in the house. That was our first snowbird mistake. While it was no danger to us, some spiders living in the moss tagged along. We quickly decided that we'd leave the Spanish moss outside.

So what is Spanish moss? Scientists call it an epiphyte or air plants. They are plants that grow on another plant without directly stealing nutrition from it. Spanish moss is not considered a parasite because it gets all needed moisture and nutrients from the air and not the tree. The tree is only a support structure.

I've heard members claiming that Spanish moss kills our golf course trees. What they're seeing is the moss inhabiting "easy" areas on the plants that are already struggling due to some other issue. The Spanish moss isn't a parasite or a disease, so it rarely ever causes a problem. A good idea is to thin the moss when it becomes too thick. After a rain storm it becomes very heavy potentially breaking branches or it may just deprive the tree of needed sunshine and nutrients.

In theory, these air plants prefer to grow on southern live oaks and bald cypress trees because they provide a menu filled with Calcium (Ca),

Magnesium (Mg), Potassium (K), Nitrogen (N) and Phosphorous (P). Spanish moss does seem to grow significantly more on weakened, dying, or dead trees than on the healthy, live ones. When a plant is struggling, the leaves will often thin, providing the Spanish moss with additional sunlight. That causes the moss to grow more vigorously. Consequently, it seems like the Spanish moss is causing a problem, but it really isn't.

The best way to remove Spanish moss is by hand. I suggest wearing gloves to protect you from the creepy crawlers that tag along. It may or may not help the tree but it won't hurt. If you pull the moss strands from the branches, it's best to place them right in a container. If you let it fall to the ground, it has a tendency to pick up chiggers, the invisible, itch-producing mites lying in wait for innocent victims like you.

For those of you that are interested, Amazon sells a 1 lb. bag of Preserved Natural Spanish Moss for \$15.75, but you better hurry because there were only 11 bags left when I last checked. That price includes free shipping for Amazon Prime members. But for Peridia members, it's free if you pull it off a tree yourself. To clean it, ask your neighbor if you can use their microwave. Just dampen the moss, place it in a bowl, and nuke it for about 30 seconds, watching it carefully. Afterward, remove the plant from the bowl and lay it out to dry on a towel. Package it in those plastic bags delivered with your morning paper. Imagine the money you could save. Snowbirds, feel free to take it north.

'Gone Fishin' and Securing your vehicle By: Pam Wallace, Chairman Crimewatch Committee

Now that warm weather is here, we are enjoying the outdoors more. We have had numerous members call and advise that non-members are fishing in various Peridia lakes. Only members can fish in our lakes. A couple of members have confronted the fishermen and a couple have called the police. The sheriff's office has advised me of the following:

- 1. Do not confront anyone. If you feel threatened or in danger, call 911.
- 2. If you call them, please use the non-emergency line, which is 941-747-3011.
- 3. Only a member of the Master Board or Tom Donato (or another employee that he designates) can have someone trespassed off the property. A member cannot trespass someone from the common property. Tom, his designee or a member of the master board must be present and available to sign the trespass order.
- 4. Information regarding fishing can be found on Page 25 of the Peridia phone book, Section 7, Paragraph O and P. and states among other things that fishing is permitted in lakes adjoining the golf course only when the course is not open for golf, and all fishing is for sport (catch and release).

Also, please remember when your car is not in the garage, make sure nothing of value is in the vehicle and that it is locked. Several surrounding neighborhoods are experiencing vehicle break-ins during the night.

MASTER BOARD ANNOUNCEMENT

In an effort to maintain quality and safety as well as the best service possible to all our residents, the Master Board has established the following policy:

- 1. All residents with an outstanding balance remaining on their minimum can contact the Food and Beverage Manager to place any order larger than 3 meals before May 15. These orders will be treated like an event and must be received four days before requested day of pickup.
- 2. Raw food will not be available for to-go orders or any order, i.e. uncooked steaks/raw meat.
- 3. We do not have a package goods license for alcoholic beverages and by law cannot offer this as an option.

This policy will allow for the Chef and the F&B Manager to plan and order supplies for larger orders without shorting the dining membership
