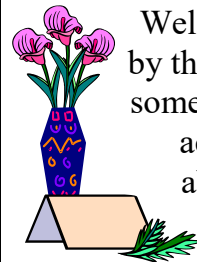

General Manager's Column

Well it is November 1, 2016 and I predict that this season will be HUGE! Yes, you heard me right; I am seeing a lot of our members returning earlier than they returned last year and they are looking to get into the swing of things. We have added a happy hour on Mondays that you just can't miss...50% off all drinks and FREE Chef bites from 4:00PM to 6:00PM. The place has been packed. Our great Lunch Buffet has gone up to \$8.50 and is now available from 11:00AM to 4:00PM Monday through Saturday. Each morning we try to e-mail the lunch special and the soup of the day, so take a minute to open your e-mail each day. There will be times that we will have to close the buffet early do to large functions so we will have time to set up, but we will post that information in the Scorecard or through our e-mail blasts. Tuesdays thru Saturday we now have a Chef's light bar menu from 4:00 to closing. This means that the restaurant has food available from 11:00AM to closing every day except Sunday.

The golf practice cage, which was destroyed during Hermine; should be back up by December 1 with big improvements. We are trying to make the cage out of steel poles so that the cage will withstand the next big storm and all of the storms to follow. Our pool bar cover should be back up just in time for our Cheeseburgers In Paradise party on November 9; don't miss out on this event, it will be fun.

Comment Cards...I receive about ten comment cards a week but most are from the public that are using our facilities. What I would like is to hear from you the members of the Association. I want to hear about your experiences from the Golf Course, the way you were welcomed in the Golf Shop to your first step into the bar or restaurant and the quality of the food. Comment Cards can be positive and or negative but it is a way for me to gauge in how we are doing and if we need to do better. The Comment Card station is next to my office so while you are filling the card out you can stick your head in and say hi.

Ray has started to oversee the fairways, approaches, and tees for this season. This process will take about two weeks so please keep the carts on the cart paths, or in the roughs and stay off the fairways. Thank You!

Mitch is very excited about the start of this season. He had the Golf Shop painted and he re-arranged the merchandise which has given him plenty of room to bring in a lot of new product, for our men and ladies. Mitch and I worked with EZ-GO to put together a new cart lease, which will start on January 1, 2017. This lease is for 51 months and will give us an opportunity at the end of the lease to bid our business out to other cart companies; this was achieved by getting EZ-GO to give us a 51-month warranty on our batteries. Our warranty on our present lease is only for the first 36 months and a set of batteries for one cart run \$750, fourth year can be very costly.

Mitch was also able to get EZ-GO to give us a replacement for James' cart, which we have been leasing; we will now **own** this cart at no cost to us.

Members have asked me how we deliver the Scorecard each month. I tell them that each HOA has volunteers that come in and pick up and then deliver one Scorecard to each household in their Association. The volunteers that provide this service do an excellent job and are greatly appreciated by our office staff. Those of you who are seasonal please take the time to let your volunteer know when you are back or when you head up north so that your volunteer will know to start or stop delivering. If you do not know who your volunteer is, please contact Nancy in the business office and she will provide you with the name of your volunteer. Take a moment to thank him or her for their time.

Remember, I always have time for your questions or comments, so please stop by my office. My door is always open.

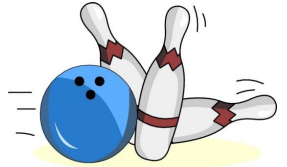

Pumpkin Alfredo Pasta

Ingredients

- kosher salt
- 1 lb. pasta
- extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/4 c. sage leaves
- Flaky sea salt
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 15-oz. can pumpkin purée
- 1/4 c. dry white wine
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tbsp. unsalted butter, cut into slices and chilled
- 1/2 c. freshly grated Parmesan
- 1 c. sour cream



Directions

1. Bring an 8-quart stock pot of water to a boil and generously season with salt. Cook pasta according to al dente package directions.
2. Meanwhile, in a small skillet over medium-high heat add, 4 to 5 tablespoon olive oil; when oil is hot but not smoking add dry sage leaves and fry 4 to 5 seconds until crispy. Transfer with a slotted spoon to a paper towel-lined plate. Sprinkle with sea salt; set aside.
3. In a large skillet over medium heat, sauté onions and garlic, about 1 minute. Add pumpkin and white wine and season with 1 teaspoon salt and 1/2 teaspoon black pepper; simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in cheese and butter until melted and creamy. Stir in sour cream and pasta until well coated.
4. Garnish with fried sage leaves and serve.

Skimmers-Again!

With the recent discoveries of skimmers at a Sarasota gas station and at an ATM in a 7-11 in Bradenton, it seems like a good time to visit the issue again. An officer from the Criminal Investigations Division suggests paying with cash inside gas stations whenever possible. If you don't have cash, use a credit card, not a debit card. Credit cards have better fraud protection.

Check for signs of tampering at the pump. This might include a broken security seal over the door. If something seems out of place, notify gas station personnel.

Jiggle ATM card readers. If it moves around, something may be amiss. Police say a genuine card reader should be affixed to the ATM so well that it will not move, while a skimmer overlaid over the card reader may move. Examine the ATM to see if anything looks out of place. This might mean the bottom panel is a different color from the rest of the machine because it is a fake piece of plastic placed over the real bottom panel and the keypad. Examine the keyboard. Does it appear to be too thick or different from how it usually looked in the past? Again this could mean an overlay over the actual keypad. Check for cameras, somewhere above the screen or keypad. For basic security, always shield the keyboard with your hand so that a camera cannot record your access numbers.

Monitor bank statements and credit card charges regularly to spot unauthorized charges. If something doesn't add up, contact your bank or credit card company immediately. You can also contact the Bradenton Police Department at 941-932-9312.

Recipe of the Month

Chocolate Pumpkin Cake

INGREDIENTS:

- 3/4 cup butter, softened
- 1-1/2 cups sugar
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2-1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1 can (15 ounce) solid-pack pumpkin
- 1 cup (6 ounce) semisweet chocolate chips
- 2 ounces unsweetened chocolate, melted and cooled
- 3/4 cup finely chopped pecans, divided



DIRECTIONS:

1. In a large bowl, cream butter and sugars until light and fluffy. Add eggs one at a time. Beat in vanilla. Combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda and cinnamon; add to the creamed mixture alternately with pumpkin. Fold in chocolate chips.
2. Divide batter in half. Stir melted chocolate into one portion. In a well-greased 10-in. fluted tube pan, sprinkle 1/2 cup pecans. Spoon chocolate batter over pecans; top with pumpkin batter. Sprinkle with remaining pecans.
3. Bake at 325° for 65-70 minutes.



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
