

Salmon with Lemon, Capers, and Rosemary

Ingredients:

- 4 (6-ounce) salmon fillets
- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1 tablespoon minced fresh rosemary leaves
- 8 lemon slices (about 2 lemons)
- 1/4 cup lemon juice (about 1 lemon)
- 1/2 cup Marsala wine (or white wine)
- 4 teaspoons capers
- 4 pieces of aluminum foil



Brush top and bottom of salmon fillets with olive oil and season with salt, pepper, and rosemary. Place each piece of seasoned salmon on a piece of foil large enough to fold over and seal. Top each piece of the salmon with 2 lemon slices, 1 tablespoon of lemon juice, 2 tablespoons of wine, and 1 teaspoon of capers. Wrap up salmon tightly in the foil packets.

Place a grill pan over medium-high heat or preheat a gas or charcoal grill. Place the foil packets on the hot grill and cook for 10 minutes for a 1-inch thick piece of salmon. Serve in the foil packets.

Beware the Con Artist

Yes, scammers are really out to get you! Con artists are skilled at manipulating people into divulging personal information and even handing over money on the spot. They steal mail left out for the postal carrier, hoping to snag an envelope with a check in it. Then they can engage in check fraud. They use online communications to solicit information and funds. Social engineering attacks are on the upswing. In these attacks, they rely heavily on human interaction, either by phone or e-mail, to engage or enrage you in order to capture financial or personal information...or to steal your money.

The IRS scam is alive and well. To report an individual calling you from "the IRS" to demand past due taxes, call 1-800-366-4484 or go online to <u>www.tigta.gov</u>, for the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration.

Con artists often have some information about you to make an e-mail seem legitimate, especially if you are rushed or distracted. Be on your guard! Be selective about where you use a debit card. Some agents working with financial crimes advise only using a debit card at an ATM machine. They also suggest being alert to skimmers at point-of-sale machines, such as gas pumps, and ATM machines. One agent suggested never using a credit card at the gas pump because of the difficulty in spotting some skimmers. He recommends always going inside to pay. While this may seem extreme, it may be worth considering if your card is compromised every year or multiple times every year.

Remember never, ever provide or verify any personal information including computer information and never send any money to a stranger who contacts you, no matter how much they threaten you or try to intimidate you. Verify that they are who they say they are by calling back the company/agency they claim to represent. Report suspicious contacts to the police or appropriate authority. Be safe and don't be a victim!






