



General Manager's Column

I want to compliment Ray Bartels and his crew on the great job they did on getting the course ready for play in such a short period of time. They were out there at 6:00AM on Tuesday and had the first 7 holes cleared of the debris by 3:00PM that same day. On Thursday they were mowing tees, greens, fairways and raking sand traps. Our course re-opened on Friday and we had 95 golfers come out to play.

James and Frank from Clubhouse Maintenance were the first ones on the scene the day after the storm and jumped right into the massive clean up around the Clubhouse. Please take a second to thank the guys for job well done.

The damage from Hurricane Irma was limited to trees and a lot of debris on the Golf Course and around the Clubhouse. We lost 4 trees around the Clubhouse and another 18 trees out on the Golf Course. Val and I met with our insurance agents on the September 13 to ask about our deductible on a named storm. We have a \$5,000 deductible on a no name storm but because the storm was named Irma the coverage now falls under our Named Storm Policy which has a deductible of 3% of our total value on the Clubhouse and Golf Course. The total value is \$3,052,761, so our deductible is \$91,582 and we project our loss to be in the range of \$52,000 to \$60,000. This covers all of the clean up around the Clubhouse, the clean up on the Golf Course, removal of the down trees, the replacement of the fence on Pro Am and the loss of revenue from restaurant and golf course operations. This means that our losses from Hurricane Irma are less than the deductible.

At a past BOD meeting we had a conversation about Coyotes and the BOD instructed me to send out an e-mail blast letting our members know about the presence of the coyotes and the danger that they present. This past week we sent out another e-mail blast to let our members know that the coyotes are back and more aggressive this time. When walking late at night be aware of your surroundings and keep your pet on a leash. In the meantime we are looking into hiring a trapper to set a number of traps around Peridia. We have been in contact with the County and the State to see what they can do to help us; neither is able to help us.

A number of our snow birds have landed back here in Peridia and we are so glad to see the early migration. Judy and Chef Todd have put together a lot of great specials for Wednesday and Thursday nights. So grab your friends and get over here and enjoy your Club.

It is extremely pleasing to know how our community remained strong before, during, and after enduring a hit from Hurricane IRMA. I admit I was up north in Pennsylvania worrying and watching the whole ordeal on television, so I have no personal experience with major storm survival. While members focused on preparing their homes, Peridia remained in the hands of Tom Donato who focused on protecting Peridia. He had staff remove all potentially flying objects from the Course. The net from the practice cage and the tennis cage screens were taken down and stored. Realizing that there wouldn't be much interest in golfing nor dining, he made a quick decision and closed the Golf Course and Restaurant for three days. After all, our staff also needed time to escape north or prepare to hunker down with their families. Conscientiously, Donato remained to safeguard the Clubhouse and Pro Shop. He moved all remaining potentially flying objects, chairs and tables, etc., inside for safety. Tom secured Peridia before he headed home.

The Golf Course was hit extremely hard as you might have determined in GM Donato's email. Donato kept me up to date with pictures of the trees that had broken, been uprooted or toppled over completely. No wonder it took nearly a week to safely open the Course.

He sent me pictures of a wooden border fence behind the homes on Pro Am that had numerous sections destroyed. Thankfully most of Peridia's common property, except for a few trees, was saved. The overall cleanup of our community has taken several weeks and still may not be entirely complete.

All along, Donato planned to get the Club open, ASAP. He invited members to the Restaurant on Wednesday, September 13. Food and drinks were ready at Peridia. He always tells me, "The Club should be where members want to meet their friends." He longs for a full house, the more the merrier! So Members, "Come on down."

Getting life back to normal was Donato's goal. Clean up took multiple days of effort as did driving home on crowded highways with fear of getting stranded without gasoline. Peridia's landscape looks a bit different, but its heart will be stronger from the experience. Hopefully golf scores will improve and play will get faster since getting behind certain trees won't be a problem anymore. Thanks, Tom and Staff.

Gets Celebrate! With IRMA behind us, I again realize how lucky we are to live in this community. The reunion of Peridia friends will be extra special this year. The Welcome Back Party, "*Octoberfest*," scheduled for October 20, will be very joyous, as members will get to see all the smiling faces of IRMA survivors.

It is always a good idea to keep the shrubbery trimmed on the sides of your house, not just in case of hurricanes, but for safety purposes and crime prevention.

If you are unfamiliar with the app called "Nextdoor.com" please look at it and see if it is something you would like to have. It is a great source of information from neighbors, both in Peridia and surrounding communities and was very helpful during the hurricane and allows you to reach out for all types of services, repairs, doctors, and items that you would like to purchase or sell. It also was useful to see what stores were open, where gas could be found and other supplies that were needed prior to and after the hurricane. The Sheriff's department posts regular informative updates and even sends a nightly reminder at 9:00 PM reminding people to lock their doors and close their garage doors. Several people have told me that they appreciate that extra reminder.

It was very heart-warming to see so many neighbors reaching out to others. One neighbor even organized a group of volunteers to help with the clean-up for those who could not do it. That is just another example of the kindness and generosity that we have in Peridia.

Welcome Back to our 'snowbirds. We have had a safe summer with no crime activity with the occasional exception of items taken from unlocked cars and garages where the doors were left open.
