Golf Etiquette Section: This month I want to talk about Blue Flag rules and regulations. Golf Carts that use blue flags may drive to within 10 feet in front of the greens and tee boxes. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and the next tee box except on holes 7, 8 and 18 where you may drive on the rough to the tee markers. A blue flag does not allow you to drive between the green and sand traps. Also, no blue flags will be issued when cart path only is in effect. Driving carts too close to greens and tees will result in compaction problems. We want to keep Peridia and its Golf Course in great condition and this is one way to do that.

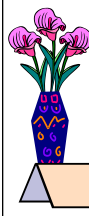

General Manager's Column

August started and ended with rainy weather which hurt both golf and restaurant revenues. Our total revenues for August missed budget by \$22,495. Cost of Goods Sold came in under budget by \$3,798. Our expenses for the month came in under budget by \$10,534 which helped bring our loss for the month of August to \$8,162. Our YTD numbers show revenues are down by \$33,049, our COGS are under budget by \$9,767 and our expenses are under budget by \$14,785 leaving the club showing a loss of \$8,496 YTD.

Our Golf Course now has all 18 holes open again, we were scheduled to open Tuesday, September 11 and ended up opening all 18 holes on Monday, September 24. Mondragon will still be out on the course finishing up with the installation around the ponds. The budget is \$675,000 for this project and we are on budget. There is another \$35,000 that will be spent on the pump station in upgrading the pumps but that won't be done until January. That work will complete the \$710,000 expenditure that was approved last year.

The Clubhouse remodel was crazy with all of the sub-contractors running into each other trying to stay on schedule. Our target date to re-open was September 10 and we did not get open until the September 13, this was due to the removal of the material that was on the soffits. We opened with our new banquet chairs and our old bar stools. Our new more colorful dining room chairs and stools will be here around the first of the month. The restaurant committee is still out looking for additional pictures to help fill the walls.

Kitchen remodel went well, the Chef is saying that Christmas came early this year. He got everything that he asked for on his list: Double Stack Convection Ovens, Fryer, 6 pan Steamer, 6 Burner range w/24-inch griddle, Floor Mixer, Alto Shaam and a Walk-in Freezer.

I am trying to finalize our Clubhouse remodel costs with the General Contractor but he is still waiting on the sub-contractors to invoice him. So as soon as he has the final bill I plan to sit and go over all of the invoices to make sure that we received everything that we purchased and that we were not over charged.

The update on the Weir is that Bennett Construction Company has finalized the drawings for the installation of the box at the end of the inflow pipe. This box will slow down the storm water flowing off Augusta so that the water will no longer stir up the particles that lie on the floor of the pond and drift over to the drainage area and clog the filtering screen. Bennett will be putting together a price to construct the box, we should have that number by the end of this month. Bennett cannot start pumping the water out of the lake until the rainy season is over.

President's Blog



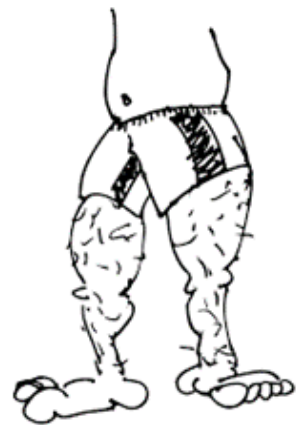

Staying Safe and Protecting your Assets

Welcome Back to all our snowbirds! We had a great summer, with no crime related issues. However, Manatee County continues to experience car break-ins throughout various communities, so I wanted to pass on some tips that will aid in keeping your car and home less vulnerable to intrusion.

If you have a garage but park your car outside with a garage opener in the car, then you might want to consider placing your garage door opener inside. A thief can break into your car, and then use the garage door opener within your car, to easily gain access to your

garage and possibly your house as well. If you need to park outside but want to use the garage opener to enter the house when you get home, then develop a habit of bringing the garage door opener inside with you. Over time, it'll become as habitual as always grabbing your keys and your purse/wallet, and this will go a long way in preventing serious break-ins. Yes, even if the doors are locked! Thieves can break through the windows to take your belongings if they feel motivated enough. So, don't give anyone any reason for them to target your car. Even if it's something as simple as a blanket - by leaving this out in the open, thieves may think that the blanket exists in there to hide something valuable beneath it. By keeping your car completely clear of your possessions, it will not only save you the trouble of recovering your valuables and the inconvenience of having to fix broken car windows. To be extra safe, lock up your car's compartment and trunk from the inside as well. This way, if someone is able to somehow get in the car, they aren't able to go through these parts of the vehicle. A yard that is kept up goes a long way in deterring criminals, especially when the whole neighborhood is well maintained. This lets would-be criminals know that people are active in your neighborhood, and also reduces hiding spots for them. Try to keep clear line of sights to your entryways, so that if a criminal is trying to break in, then they'll be easily visible from across the street or by a neighbor driving by. Large bushes and trees that block the view of your house, makes it a more likely target for thieves as they can remain hidden while breaking in.

It is estimated that one in five Americans over the age of 65 are victims of financial abuse – and the average loss is \$120K. Financial abuse can be in the form of a scam or it can also be perpetrated by family or friends who syphon off money from older loved ones. Nearly half of older Americans surveyed recently reported they know someone who had been a victim of a scam. Despite the prevalence of these scams, seniors are often in denial about their vulnerability. 40% of seniors said they have the recommended key legal documents in place; a will, advanced healthcare directive, power of attorney for healthcare and financial matters, but they have not shared this information with their children.

While often awkward, having those conversations with your children can help protect seniors from scams and navigating any fallout if the worst should occur. “A majority of the cases could be avoided if families were communicating - if people were talking to their children and if children were talking to their parents”.
