



General Manager's Corner

It has been a quiet summer so far, those members that did not go up north for the summer are now taking their summer vacations. However, our revenues for the month of July were well ahead of budget. Golf is up by 507 rounds over this same time last year and golf revenues are up by \$9,100 over last July numbers. Our Food and Beverage revenues are up by \$8,000 over last July numbers. Revenue is showing us that the members and our public users are still spending and enjoying the Club. BUT! Expenses are hurting our bottom line! Costs are up in many areas especially those areas associated with the economy and inflation (Gas & Propane costs, Wages and associated employee costs, Property Insurance, Electricity, Bank Fees, Paper & Plastic Goods, Cleaning Supplies and Legal & Professional fees.) We will continue to look at ways to change our business model to better control our costs without sacrificing the members' needs.

Our planned capital project to replace the bulkhead at our irrigation lake and expand the driving range mats has been put on hold for this year. We are reevaluating the project since the two bids just received have been \$46,000 & \$51,000 which are more than twice the project estimate received in August, 2021. We will be addressing this project when the 2023 Capital Project budget is developed.

USA Fencing has been hired to repair the vinyl fence on 45th St., damaged when the car drove through the fence. Estimated completion time is mid September.

The drainage problem at the #7 tee box has been corrected thus eliminating the wet area along the middle of the new cart path. The problem of golfers riding carts off the cart path at #7 & #8 tee boxes will hopefully be resolved when we add concrete to the left side of the cart paths. It would certainly help if all golfers would keep all four tires of the golf cart on the cart paths at all times.

Bingo:

It appears that our bingo callers have lost interest in calling the games each month. Years ago, we had four volunteers that took turns calling bingo which worked out to having to call every forth bingo night. We need to get back to Member volunteers to call the bingo games each bingo night. Our Food and Beverage Manager, Brad Little, has called bingo the last two times. Thank you Brad for a job well done. Bingo is a very popular event and we need to get back to having a Member Bingo Committee responsible for the event. Please contact Brad to volunteer for the Bingo Committee and let him know that you are interested in calling our Bingo.

At our last BOD Meeting the swimming pool rules were changed and approved by the BOD to read as follows:

SWIMMING POOL RULES (Full revision August 22, 2022)

- A. Posted at Entrance to Pool / Tiki Area:
 - 1. Tiki Bar is open to all.
 - 2. Pool is for members and guests only.
 - 3. No pets allowed in the pool / Tiki area.
 - 4. Alcoholic beverages must be purchased from the Tiki Bar.

B. Rules posted at the pool are to be observed at all times:

- 1. WARNING: NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK
- 2. No glass containers of any kind.
- 3. No food near pool.
- 4. No running, horseplay, jumping or diving* is permitted,
- 5. Bathing load is thirty (30) persons. *

(* indicated Manatee County mandated postings)

- C. Four-inch (4") letters on Edge of Pool "NO DIVING" Members and guest are expected to ensure compliance. *
- D. When the kitchen is open, all food shall be ordered through the Tiki Bar. Any refuse shall be disposed of properly in the containers provided.
- E. The Club Staff are the only persons authorized to adjust the pool heater, pump and filter.
- F. The Pool area is available for special occasions by member groups. Please contact the Club Office to schedule an event and review specific rules and regulations.
- G. Occasionally the pool will be closed for maintenance. Please do not enter the pool area when the closed sign is posted at the entrance gate.


