



The second bathroom is now a unisex bathroom with a dead bolt that shows you when the room is occupied or vacant. James did some patching and painting of the walls in the Clubhouse; he tried to clean around all of the air ducts in the building but had some problems with the ceilings that have the sound proofing materials. President's Blog

I feel I'm acting like my Irish setter this summer. Irish setters get one idea in their heads and stubbornly focus on it. They refuse to let it go. I've been drumming the changes to our Master Documents into members' minds this summer with weekly emails. I just kept sending them because that's the BOD's # 1 priority as we close out 2016. The proposed changes affect two of our documents, the:

BYLAWS OF PERIDIA PROPERTY OWNERS ASSOCIATION, INC. and the MASTER DECLARATION OF COVENANTS, CONDITIONS AND RESTRICTIONS FOR PERIDIA

If you aren't signed up for Peridia's emails, you can still see the proposed changes on the Peridia website, in the Peridia's *Members' Area*. Look for the "Master Board's Corner." All eleven (11) articles with changes due to Florida Statutes and rewritten by our HOA attorney are listed there. Changes are made in BLUE. You'll also find the Florida Statutes with *BLUE italics* referencing corresponding paragraphs.

There maybe additional articles added to the website in October. A committee of members from all seven components will review and may recommend additional changes initiated by our attorney. Why did he advise changes other than ones affected by FL Statutes?

As listed in the June Blog:

To eliminate obsolete provisions.

To eliminate provisions no longer observed or enforced.

To eliminate provisions that conflict with current laws.

To improve poorly drafted documents by clarifying ambiguous provisions.

To give the Peridia Property Owners Association's Board of Directors the proper framework for governing.

To give the 7 Component Associations' members confidence that the documents accurately describe members' rights, legal procedures, etc.

Stay tuned for future potential changes.

It has been 9 years since Peridia last updated the documents. Generally speaking, it is suggested that the docs be updated every 5-7 years. Reaching a 70% approval vote, which is currently required by our documents, requires everyone's efforts.

I hope you'll help Peridia refresh your governing documents. It'll be a tail wagging accomplishment.

Chef Todd's Corner

Here it is almost fall; were does the time fly? Summer seemed to rush right past us. Soon our seasonal members will return and we can hardly wait. Thank you to all of our year round members for your support and patronage.

I hope you enjoyed your summer menus and events. The \$5.00 burger nights and the all you can eat menu's seemed to be a big hit and enjoyed by all. Rest assured you can look forward to more as we continue our search for ways to keep our members happy and with full tummies.

We will be launching our new seasonal menu at the end of this month and will be bringing back some favorite staples as well as a slew of new items to entice you all.

LEMON CURD

INGREDIENTS:

- 3 OZ SOFT BUTTER
- 1 C SUGAR
- 2 WHOLE EGGS
- 2 EGG YOLKS
- 2/3 C LEMON JUICE
- 1 TSP LEMON ZEST



DIRECTIONS:

Cream the butter and sugar together with an electric mixer until smooth and fluffy. Egg the eggs and continue to mix until the eggs are completely incorporated. While mixing slowly add the lemon juice. (The mixture will look loose and separated after this stage of preparation. Don't worry it will all come back together when you cook the mixture).

Place the mixture in a heat proof, non reactive bowl and place over a medium low heat. Stir the mixture constantly until it begins to thicken and reaches a temperature of 170 degrees.

Remove the mixture from the heat and stir in the lemon zest. Allow mixture to cool to room temperature, stirring occasionally. When cool, lay plastic wrap directly on top of mixture so a skin doesn't form.

This is a classic to serve with scones and makes an excellent cake filling, Keeps for up to three days in the refrigerator.


