



General Manager's Column

Rainy Days of Summer, hopefully by the time you read this article the rains have stopped and we are back to enjoying our Golf Course without seeing signs reading "Cart Paths Only". There have been many tee time cancellations this past two month due to rain...even though we have a short golf course "Cart Paths Only" signs tend to keep golfers from playing golf. Rounds are down by 20% compared to last June and July 2016 golf numbers.

When your golf numbers are down so will be your restaurant numbers, for June and July we are short 440 covers. Please take a minute to read this month's Scorecard it has all of the specials that we are running for the month of September. Our Wednesday, Thursday and Friday specials hopefully will give all of our members a reason to come to dinner during the month. I am excited about our Thursday night "All you can Eat Buffet" for \$11.95.

On the brighter side of Peridia is the list of projects that the staff completed during the week of Clubhouse shut down:

- 1. The Clubhouse got a fresh coat of paint, no change in color.
- 2. Alarm system has been fixed so that the sensors are all working in the Clubhouse. EMG is still working on the motion detectors in the Golf Maintenance area.
- 3. New bar cooler went in and the old cooler went out to the pool bar.
- 4. Dining room chairs all were washed and scotch guarded.
- 5. Kitchen was completely washed down from top to bottom; all of the equipment was scrubbed and polished. The kitchen floor was degreased; walk-in cooler was cleaned out and re-organized.
- 6. Back dock was pressure washed and painted.
- 7. As soon as the afternoon rains stop James is planning to fill all of the cracks and paint the pool deck. This will take about a week to complete. We will give enough notice so that our members won't be surprised to see the sign POOL CLOSED FOR REPAIRS.

Members have asked me how we deliver the Scorecard each month. I tell them that each HOA has volunteers that come in and pick up and then deliver one scorecard to each household in their Association. The volunteers that provide this service do an excellent job and should be greatly appreciated. Those of you who are seasonal please take the time to let your volunteer know when you are back or when you head up north so that your volunteer will know to start or stop delivering. If you would like to reach out to your volunteer to thank him/her for their time and effort, contact Nancy in the business office and she will provide you with the name of your volunteer.

Remember, I always have time for your questions or comments, so please stop by my office. My door is always open.

President's Blog

Mother Goose wrote, "It's raining; it's pouring. The old man is snoring." That was somewhat true this past summer at Peridia Golf and Country Club. To be fair, it's not only the men sawing wood if there's a threat of pitter, pattering rain. This summer, Goose's lyrics could have rhymed, it's raining; it's pouring. Most golfers aren't scoring.



Every summer play naturally declines at Peridia Golf and Country Club. With many of our members and tourists up north, plus frequent days with steamy heat and inclement weather, we anticipate an increased drop in tee times and restaurant patronage. Both situations cause a drought in revenue. It happens every summer and we try to budget accordingly. One can never predict what Mother Nature will bring.

We've definitely gotten a lot more precipitation this summer than last year. In June and July combined, a total of 22 inches of rain kept golfers off Peridia's greens and out of the restaurant. We were down 270 rounds played as compared to 2016. August numbers aren't looking much better. Like Goldilocks, golfers want the weather to be **"just right."** If it's too wet during the summer, golfers and particularly GMs usually think, "Rain, rain, go away. Come again another day."

A forecast of 90° wet weather places a sizzling cloud over our bottom line. The risk of excessive heat, rain or a thundershower deters golfers. They watch the nightly news and if tomorrow's report offers a 65% chance that the heavens will open up, or eggs will fry on the cart path, they find something else to do. Cancellations by phone drizzle into the Pro Shop for previously scheduled tee times. Golfers who check the forecast the day before may choose not to golf whether it ends up raining or not. Thunderstorms are no joke, especially out on the Golf Course. Florida is known as the lightning capital of the United States. Even when the temp is moderate, or the course is wet, business slow down, especially, if golfers are limited to cart path only.

Excess rain creates additional problems. Puddling water on the course can be a problem because it acts as a magnifying glass, intensifying the heat, which destroys the grass. Additional maintenance and necessary supplies for repairing the course create unanticipated costs.

The restaurant's ability to bring home the bacon necessitates that we attract patrons. If members and public are not golfing, we still need them to float into the bar and restaurant. GM Donato has sprinkled numerous promotions trying to attract members and the public to the Clubhouse especially on rainy days. He has posted many creative offers on Facebook and emailed specials to over 2,400 patrons. Each time I open those emails, I can picture the exuberance members have for Monday Night Madness and numerous specially priced deals hoping to reward those who utilize the restaurant.

As we approach the closing of the summer season it is my hope that September and October's weather will bring in the crisp sounds of well-struck golf shots ..."cha-ching, cha-ching, cha-ching."

Scams, Driver Safety Classes and More

To our snowbirds who will be returning this month 'welcome back' and to our new residents welcome to the neighborhood! The summer has been quiet which is a good thing! I do want to remind everyone to lock their vehicles if left outside and to keep their garage doors down. The Sheriff's office reports that they continue to receive reports throughout the county of items being stolen from unlocked cars and open garages.



Several residents have advised that they are receiving numerous calls from Microsoft demanding payments or to notify you that there is a virus on your computer that demands your attention. I have downloaded the following info from Microsoft's website for your review: Cybercriminals don't just send fraudulent email messages. They might call you on the telephone

and claim to be from Microsoft. They might also setup websites with persistent pop-ups displaying fake warning messages and a phone number to call and get the "issue" fixed. They might offer to help solve your computer problems or sell you a software license. Once they have access to your computer, they can do the following:

- Trick you into installing <u>malicious software</u> that could capture sensitive data, such as online banking user names and passwords. They might also then charge you to remove this software.
- Convince you to visit legitimate websites (like www.ammyy.com) to download software that will allow them to take control of your computer remotely and adjust settings to leave your computer vulnerable.
- Request credit card information so they can bill you for phony services.
- Direct you to fraudulent websites and ask you to enter credit card and other personal or financial information there.

"Remember, Microsoft will never proactively reach out to you to provide unsolicited PC or technical support. Any communication we have with you must be initiated by you."

AARP is offering driver safety courses this fall at select locations nearby. If you are interested in taking one of these courses, or completing it online from your home, visit AARP's website for further information. Check to see if your insurance company offers discounts on your car insurance for this class. The cost of the class is very reasonable and could save you some money on your car insurance! Our roads are more crowded than ever. 37th and 38th Streets are now open with two roundabouts. Paving on SR70 is finally being completed which should provide a smoother ride and less damage to our cars especially when entering through our main entrance! Please drive carefully.

Lastly, just a reminder to look out for one another. If you know that your neighbor lives alone and the newspaper has not been picked up as usual or you haven't seen them recently, check on them. If you suspect they may be in danger you can call the Sheriff's Dept. and they will do a welfare check.

Ingredients...

1 cup packed brown sugar 6 tablespoons bourbon

- 1/4 cup low-sodium soy sauce a
- 2 tablespoons fresh lime juice 2 teaspoons grated peeled
- Fresh Ginger
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 8 (6-ounce) salmon fillets (about 1 inch thick)
- Cooking spray

Combine the first 8 ingredients in a large zip-top plastic bag; add



salmon fillets. Seal bag, and marinate in refrigerator 30 minutes, turning bag once. Remove fillets from bag; discard marinade. Place fillets on broiler pan coated with cooking spray. Broil 11 minutes or until fish flakes easily when tested with a fork.
