

Welcome to October! First and foremost, thank you for your patience as we closed the club to brace for the uncertainty of Hurricane Helene. With the potential of power outages and safety, we asked our staff to remain at home with family until the storm passed. We were able to reopen after being closed for two days.

This month begins the prelude to the "busy" season as we prepare for the arrival of our seasonal residents. We've already started to see several Members returning and I'm looking forward to meeting everyone as they arrive. It's been 90 days since I started here at Peridia and I've had the chance to meet with several of our committees and the planning is underway for some great events and enjoyable social activities to engage the Membership in the upcoming months. I need to thank everyone for providing feedback as I start to learn the nuances and inner workings of the Club. On that note, the Restaurant Committee and our management team has created a short 25 question dining survey to gain a better understanding of the needs and wants of our Members as we strive to meet and hopefully exceed your expectations. The survey will be emailed to the membership on October 1st and will be available online for 2 weeks. The survey is totally anonymous so please be candid and honest with your answers. Each question has a comment box to provide additional details. There is also a paper version inserted in this newsletter that can be returned to a drop-off box located in the clubhouse lobby. We will share the survey results in the November Scorecard next month. Thank you for your participation.

Last month, we hosted our inaugural Supper Club event on September 14th, and it was a fun event for our Staff and the Members that attended. The ambiance, live music and Chef interaction made the evening special and we are making a few adjustments to our next event on October 19th in an effort to increase service efficiency and shorten the dinner service. Chef Elliot has created a French Themed menu for our next event. Did you know his culinary training from Le Cordon Bleu included Classical French Cuisine? Be prepared to be wowed and impressed with our next culinary experience at the October Saturday Night Supper Club! Our culinary team has been busy creating some great new menus for our next Supper Club and Social events. They've also added some great new lunch entrees to bring some variety and creativity to the Fall Menu.

The Tiki Bar is progressing nicely and we were able to have our first "soft-opening" night on Friday, September 20th along with a few Sunday afternoons with live music by the pool. We have a few internal issues to finalize and Bruce Webb and the Tiki Bar Committee have been busy making final arrangements to get fully operational. We are planning the official grand opening event on Sunday, October 27th and we can't thank Bruce and the TBC for their efforts on making this wonderful new amenity a reality. Our clubhouse maintenance team, led by our Maintenance Engineer, James Griffin, has done a fantastic job getting many Tiki Bar projects completed with the help of our Maintenance Technicians, Mason and Paul. They have been an integral part of the process and we are so lucky to have them on staff here at Peridia. Please keep an eye out for a formal announcement regarding the grand opening event of the new Tiki Bar! We are excited to get the pool open on a regular basis and the Tiki Bar fully operational in the coming days.

In addition to the new furniture arrival at the pool, we will soon be installing water bottle refill station in place of the existing drinking fountain located near the restrooms. We have also ordered six new chaise lounge chairs that are ADA compliant with a raised bed nearly twice the height of the current chairs, which will also remain on the pool deck, doubling the amount of available lounge chairs.

Our Friday Nights have been getting progressively busier and we have some great entertainment and dinner specials for you to enjoy. We've started adding some new musicians and entertainment to the schedule and you'll start to see more variety as we get into the winter season. If you're coming to the Club for dinner on Friday, please be sure to make a reservation so we can plan accordingly. I've also been asked to remind the Membership about the clubhouse dress code:

Clubhouse Dress Code: "Casual country club attire is acceptable for regular dining. Acceptable casual country club attire includes blouses for women, collared shirts for men, golf shirts, knit tops, khaki pants or walking shorts, slacks, or skirts. Jeans are discouraged. Unacceptable attire includes cut offs, gym shorts or running shorts, sweat suits, jogging suits, yoga pants, ripped, torn or ragged clothing, T-shirts and tank tops. Gentlemen must remove their hats in the dining room and after 5 PM in the bar and on Sunday all day. T-shirts and hats are allowed in the tiki bar. If entering the clubhouse from the pool area, proper cover-ups are required. Thank you for you cooperation."

We have a few fun events added to the calendar for the month of October. Our popular Thursday 9 & Dine events begin this month with a new twist. Each event will have a theme with an accompanying buffet after golf. Non-golfers are invited to join the group for the dinner buffet after golf. Please be sure to make a reservation for golf and/or dinner. On October 12th, we will host an Oktoberfest event with live entertainment featuring "Gemütlichkeit", a German Variety Show of music, dances, songs, comedy, culture and audience participation. 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
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
